

**Annual EEO Public File Report

The purpose of this EEO Public File Report (“Report”) is to comply with Section 73.2080(c)(6) of the FCC’s 2002 EEO Rule. This Report has been prepared on behalf of the Stations Employment Unit that is comprised of the following station (s): KXRK, KZNS, KEGA, KEGH, KJQN, KYMV, KUDD, KUUU, KZNS-FM and is required to be placed in the public inspection files of these stations, and posted on their websites, if they have websites.

For the purpose of this Report, a vacancy was deemed “filled” not when the offer was extended but when the hiree accepted the job offer. A person was deemed “interviewed” whether he or she was interviewed in person, over the telephone or by e-mail.

Undertaken by Stations

The station group posted to all local colleges and universities an internship program for each semester. The program was posted May 2010 September 2010 December 2010 and April 2011 to all divisions of higher education programs within the state. The interns work for one semester in their area of study to get a better understanding of the broadcast business and school credit. The Radio cluster uses as many interns as possible every semester in the operations area to expose the students the wide range of possibilities of careers that are in the broadcast industry. The radio cluster had 28 interns this past reporting period working in the promotions, operations and sales areas of our business.

The radio cluster participated in the 2011 University of Utah Student Summer Job Fair held on Thursday, February 10, 2011. The Job Fair was held in the Student Union Building from 10am to 2pm. The Promotion Directors of the radio stations and the Human Resource Director participated in this community fair explaining to the participants the many intern and job possibilities in the broadcast industry and how it helps with your career choices within the industry.

During this reporting period a management-training program for EEO training was held on October 25, 2010. The training meeting was used to review and answer questions about the EEO rules for hiring full time employees. The meeting is used to train new managers in the proper way to process paperwork and at the same time to serve as review process for those that have been here for a while.

Our Morning Show from KXRK spoke to 30-35 first year radio students at Southern Utah University on September 21, 2010 about working in radio. They visited for about 1 hour in a question and answer session with the students.

On September 23, 2010 the Morning Show from KXRK held an hour long question and answer session with the first year radio students at College of Eastern Utah. The session had about 20 to 25 students who participated.

The station group held a community job fair in conjunction with Utah Broadcaster's Association on Wednesday March 16, 2011 the job fair was held on the University of Utah campus in the student union building from 9am to 1pm. All stations broadcast liners starting at the beginning of the month about the job fair, plus information about the job fair was posted on all station web sites and flyers were sent out to all interested community outreach programs. The hiring Managers manning the booth helped students and community members with their questions about what opportunities there were in the broadcasting industry.
